### PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

### PLEASE AVOID USING PERFUMES AND COLOGNES DURING YOUR APPOINTMENT

Since most new patients require skin tests, and skin tests are inhibited by certain medications, the following recommendations are needed and should be observed for at least 5 days before the appointment. If this is not possible, please contact our office at 318-445-6221.

# **MEDICATIONS ALLOWED**

Medications for chronic medical conditions (such as diabetes and hypertension) should be continued.

Also continue:		
Asthma inhalers	Anticonvulsive (seizure) drugs	Steroids (cortisone-like drugs)
Antibiotics	Aspirin and Tylenol	Theophylline

Most nose sprays are allowed except for sprays with antihistamines such as Astelin, Astepro, Patanase, and Azelastine. Please do not take these medications for 5 days before appointment.

# **DO NOT TAKE THE MEDICATIONS LISTED BELOW (ANTIHISTAMINES) 5 DAYS PRIOR TO DOCTOR'S APPOINTMENT FOR SKIN TESTING:**
